# 2009 RMAC MEN'S SOCCER NEWS & NOTES

## FORT LEWIS TO HOST RMAC MEN'S SOCCER TOURNAMENT

Fort Lewis College in Durango will host the 2009 RMAC Men's Soccer Tournament November 6-8. The Skyhawks lead the RMAC with a 10-0-0 record. In previous seasons, the tournament host was not announced until after the regular season was concluded. But this year, in an effort to save membership expenses and maintain "student-athlete life in the balance" the RMAC has instituted a pilot program to determine the hosts of RMAC tournaments. In men's soccer, the highest seeded team with two weeks remaining in the regular season and a bid approved by the RMAC Championships Committee was named tournament host. Dirks Field is located on the campus of Fort Lewis College in Durango. Tickets for adults will be \$10 for one day or \$15 for two days. Students are \$3 for one day and \$5 for two days. Fans will also be able to watch the semi-finals and championship via the B2 networks for \$8 per game.

## ADAMS STATE COLLEGE (0-10-3)

**Team Notes:** The Grizzlies played two games last week as they completed their inaugural season. They fell by just one goal at UC-Colo- rado Springs on Tuesday (1-0) before suffering a heartbreaking 2-1 double-overtime loss to Westminster (Utah) on Sunday. The Grizzlies led 1-0 for nearly 25 minutes as junior Jesse Dunbar (Spokane, Wash.) scored his third goal of the season on a 61st minute penalty kick. Dunbar took and made both of ASC's penalty kicks this year and tied Peter Freeman (Longmont, Colo.) for the team lead in goal scoring this year. Dunbar also led the Grizzlies with 8 total points as he and Rami Avalos (Alamosa, Colo.) were tied for the team lead in assists. Playing a man down for the final 22 minutes of regulation, the Grizzlies saw their lead go away with just five minutes to go in regulation before falling with just 3:17 left in the second overtime. The Grizzlies had recorded ties in each of their three previous overtime games this season. Grizzly goalkeeper Jarod Thomas (Arvada, Colo.) made a school-record 15 saves in the match with the Griffins. He also saved a first-half penalty kick and has now made stops on three of the five penalty kicks he has faced this year. Thomas made 97 saves this season, an average of 8.08 per game that leads the RMAC. He had four 10 or more save efforts including two this week. A total of 20 different men played for ASC during the inaugural season. Only five played in all 13 games. Dunbar and Chase Talbot (Evanston, Wyo.) were the only two to start all 13. Talbot led all players with 1108 minutes.

## COLORADO CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY (2-12-2, 0-9-1 RMAC)

**Team Notes:** The Cougars played against Mesa State last week on the Friday and Fort Lewis on Saturday. The Cougars tied with Mesa State after going into double overtime. CCU was defeated by Fort Lewis, 0-11. The Cougars will be on the road Oct. 23 to play against CSU-Pueblo.

## COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES (11-2-3, 7-2-1 RMAC)

**Offense: Chike Sullivan (So., M, 6-0 - San Juan, Trinidad & Tobago / St. George's College)**

Sullivan now has five goals and two assists on the season. Alex Gunberg scored CSM's lone-goal against Fort Lewis on Friday it was his sixth goal of the season.

Decker tallied the assist on CSM's goal against Fort Lewis on Friday, Oct. 16th. The assist was his third of the season. Decker also has four goals. Decker helped CSM shutout Mesa State on Sunday, Oct. 18th, it was CSM's ninth shutout of the season.

**Team Notes:** Cale Haas notched his sixth goal of the season in Mines' win over Mesa State. Goalkeeper Manville Strand recorded his seventh shutout of the season against Mesa State. In two games this week Strand made nine saves.

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. --**August 18, 2009** -- Fort Lewis is picked to win the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference title, as voted by the league's eight head men's soccer coaches. The Skyhawks won the 2008 RMAC championship and earned a bid to the NCAA Division II men's soccer tournament.

The Skyhawks received six first place votes, while landing five players on the preseason all-conference team. Olgie Kennedy is the interim head coach this season, replacing Tim Hankinson who is now coaching a professional team in India.

Metro State is predicted to finish second, the Roadrunners also went to last year's NCAA tournament and are led by Preseason Player of the Year **Steven Emory** (Fort Collins).

Colorado Mines is third, followed by CSU-Pueblo, Regis, Mesa State, UCCS and Colorado Christian. Adams State begins men's soccer this year, but will not play an RMAC schedule until 2010.

The top four teams in the regular season advance to the RMAC tournament, which will be played on November 5th and 7th. Three weeks prior to the championships the top team in the league at that time with an acceptable bid will host the tournament.
