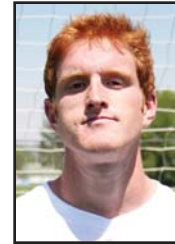

2010 RMAC MEN'S SOCCER NEWS & NOTES

ADAMS STATE COLLEGE (0-2-0, 0-0-0 RMAC)

Offense: Hawken Hanna (Freshman, Midfield, 5-5, Haslett, Mich./Haslett HS)

Hanna tallied the first goal of his young career as well as the first of the season for the Grizzlies in just his second collegiate game. He started both games for the Grizzlies on opening weekend at home against Eastern New Mexico and Mesa State, recording one shot in each game, both of them on goal. He connected against Mesa State just over 10 minutes into the second half from 30 yards out, placing a shot just over the head of the Mavericks' keeper for the score. Hanna played 163 minutes in two games over the weekend, and played all 90 in ASC's Sunday afternoon contest. He is currently the team leader in goals (1) points (2), and shots on goal (2).

Defense: Paul Pizza (Freshman, Goalkeeper, 6-0, Alamosa, Colo./Alamosa HS)

Pizza saw his first action as a Grizzly in the second half of Adams State's season opener against Eastern New Mexico, making four saves on 17 shots faced in 45 minutes of action. In his first career start on Sunday against Mesa State, Pizza made four more saves, all in the first half against the visiting Mavericks. On Sunday, Pizza faced 20 shots from the Mavericks in his 90 minutes of work, and only allowed one goal in the second half. The 20 shots faced by Pizza in the Grizzlies' match against Mesa State is the seventh most in program history.

Team Notes: In the Grizzlies season-opener on Friday against Eastern New Mexico, freshman forward Chris Roggow (Evergreen, Colo.) set the ASC men's soccer record for most shots on goal in a game, placing all three of his shots on target in his first collegiate game and start. His three total shots in the game also ties him for fourth for the single-game record in that category.

COLORADO CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY (0-1-0, 0-0-0 RMAC)

Team Notes: The Cougars lost their season and home opener Friday to Mesa State, 3-0. They will continue action Sept. 10 at Montana State, Billings and Sept. 11 at Great Falls.

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY - PUEBLO (0-1-0, 0-0-0 RMAC)

Offense: Jordan Hanson (Junior, Midfield, 5-9, Puyallup, Wash./Puyallup HS)

Hanson fired two shots, both on goal, in CSU-Pueblo's season opener against #25 Cal State San Bernardino (L, 0-3).

Defense: Jacob Blum (Junior, Goalkeeper, 6-1, Peoria, Ariz./Sunrise Mountain HS)

Blum combined with junior Patrick Markus for nine saves against 25th-ranked Cal State-San Bernardino Sept. 4. The Pack lost their season opening match, 3-0.

COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES (1-0-0, 0-0-0 RMAC)

Offense: Baski Baker (Freshman, Forward, 6-5, Socorro, N.M./Socorro HS)

Baker scored the game winning goal in the 49th minute Friday at home against No. 1 Fort Lewis. It was his first collegiate goal of the season. Baker finished the game with two points and two shots (both on goal).

Defense: Manville Strand (Sophomore, Goalkeeper, 5-10, Las Vegas, Nev./Spring Valley HS)

RMAC Defensive Player of the Week

Team Notes: Phillip Wilson tallied the assist on Baker's goal against Fort Lewis. The win by Mines snapped Fort Lewis' 21-game winning streak. It was also Mines' first win over Fort Lewis since 2004.

FORT LEWIS COLLEGE (1-1-0, 0-0-0 RMAC)

Offense: Corey Dean (Junior, Midfield, 5-8, Albuquerque, N.M./New Mexico/Sandia HS)

Dean scored two goals in a one-minute, 23-second span to lift Fort Lewis to a 4-1 neutral site win over No. 11 West Texas A&M.

Defense: Jamie Cunningham (Senior, Defense, 6-2, Scottsdale, Ariz./Pinnacle HS)

Cunningham helped the Skyhawks hold two top-20 opponents to one goal each in action this weekend. Fort Lewis fell at No. 18 Colorado Mines on Friday, 1-0, before defeating No. 11 West Texas A&M on Sunday, 4-1, in Golden, Colo.

MESA STATE COLLEGE (2-0-0, 0-0-0 RMAC)

Offense: Steve Shaw (Senior, Forward, 6-1, Albuquerque, N.M./MidAmerica Univ./Highland HS)

Shaw posted an assist and two shots in a 3-0 road win at Colorado Christian on Friday. Two days later at Adams State, he tallied a goal, an assist and five shots in the 4-1 win. In two games, Shaw registered four points, seven shots and two shots on goal.

Defense: Alex Mattevi (Senior, Defense, 6-0, Loomis, Calif./Del Oro HS)

Mattevi anchored a defense that allowed only one goal on the weekend against Colorado Christian (W, 3-0) and Adams State (W, 4-1), while scoring two goals of his own. The goals were his first collegiate goals of his career.

Team Notes: The Mavericks jumped out to a 2-0 start for the second time in its four year history.
