2010 RMAC WOMEN'S SOCCER NEWS & NOTES

ADAMS STATE COLLEGE (1-1-0, 0-0-0 RMAC)

Offense: Jessica Hellweg (Junior, Forward, 5-8, Island Lake, Ill./Wauconda HS)

In the Grizzlies season-opener on Friday, Hellweg tallied three points, scoring the first goal of the season for Adams State to grab a 1-0 lead, and then got the assist on the freshman Whitney Smith's game-winning goal just minutes before halftime. Hellweg's goal came at the 34:19 mark following an Adams State corner kick, where she struck the ball off the bounce to put the Grizzlies on the board. Just six minutes later, Hellweg took a shot that was blocked by the ThunderWolves, but Smith was in the right spot and managed to redirect the ball into the net and give Hellweg credit for the assist. Hellweg again put ASC on top Sunday afternoon as the Grizzlies hosted Midland Lutheran (Neb.) at Murphy Field. After dribbling towards the middle of the field from the right sideline, Hellweg delivered a strike from 25 yards out. Hellweg led the Grizzlies offense with three shots Sunday, including two on goal, but was unable to find the net again as ASC fell to the Warriors. The two goals, one assist opening weekend moved Hellweg up in the ASC record books. With two goals, Hellweg has upped her career total to 10, giving sole possession of fifth-place on the Grizzlies' all-time list. In addition, her five points for the weekend gives her a career total of 23, the sixth best mark in program history.

Defense: Hannah Kohlts (Freshman, Goalkeeper, 5-3, Littleton, Colo./Arapahoe HS)

Kohlts saw her first action on Friday afternoon, coming off the bench for the Grizzlies for the final 30 minutes of their season-opener for starting keeper Oralia Gutierrez (Kearns, Utah) who went down with an injury. The freshman recorded three saves and allowed no goals off the bench to preserve the Grizzlies 3-1, season-opening win. Kohlts was back in the net to start Sunday's contest against Midland Lutheran (Neb.), recording one save and allowing two goals in 90 minutes of action.

Team Notes: Friday's season-opening match saw sisters Kaylee and Whitney Smith (Platte City, Mo.) both get involved in the action. Kaylee, a sophomore, took a corner kick that was put in the net by junior Jessica Hellweg (Island Lake, Ill.) to record an assist on the Grizzlies first goal of the season. Six minutes later, freshman Whitney corralled a rebound on a Hellweg shot and found the back of the net for her first career goal, and the game-winner, in the Grizzlies 3-1 victory. Junior Amber Drumm (Maple Valley, Wash.) scored Adams State's third and final goal in Friday's victory of CSU-Pueblo, drilling a penalty kick past the ThunderWolves goalie. The goal was the eighth of Drumm's career, moving her into a tie for sixth in Grizzly history. It was also the second time in her career that she has successfully converted a penalty kick, moving her into a tie for first all-time at ASC, and was the first penalty kick for the Grizzlies since Drumm scored on one in her first collegiate game against Wayne State (Neb.) on August 28, 2008. The Grizzlies started off the 2010 campaign 1-0 for the first time since 2008, when they opened their season with a 3-2 victory over Wayne State (Neb.). The victory over CSU-Pueblo was the second straight over the ThunderWolves, as Adams State recorded a victory by the same score on October 16, 2009 in Pueblo, Colo. In the prior six meetings, the Grizzlies were 0-5-1 against the ThunderWolves.

COLORADO CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY (0-2-0, 0-0-0 RMAC)

Team Notes: Colorado Christian dropped a 1-0 decision to Azusa Pacific on Sept. 3. They lost again on Monday at Biola, 1-0. The Cougars return home Sept. 10 and 12 to face Montana State, Billings and Texas Woman's.

COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES (0-1-0, 0-0-0 RMAC)

Offense: Megan Woodworth (Sophomore, Midfield, 5-7, Centennial, Colo./Smoky Hill HS)

Against No. 25 Minnesota-Duluth, Woodworth scored a goal on three shots as the Orediggers tied with the Bulldogs, 1-1. Against Incarnate Word two days later, she scored CSM's only goal of the game in the 2-1 setback. She posted four points, 10 shots and six shots on goal as CSM went 0-1-1 in the opening weekend.

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY - PUEBLO (0-2-0, 0-0-0 RMAC)

Offense: Angela Mendoza (Senior, Forward, 5-4, Oxnard, Calif./Ventura College/Oxnard HS)

Mendoza came off the bench in the season opener at Adams State to score a goal in the 3-1 loss on Sept. 3. The next day she played the first half against Abilene Christian at home (L, 2-0).

FORT LEWIS COLLEGE (2-0-0, 0-0-0 RMAC)

Defense: Christine Schmelzle (Senior, Goalkeeper, 5-9, Flagstaff, Ariz./Coconino HS)

Team Notes: FLC received late goals in both 1-0 victories this past weekend at home. Torrey Larson scored at 89:00 in a 1-0 win vs. St. Cloud State on Friday before Hayley Hollenga scored a golden goal at 104:58 in a 1-0 over Augie on Sunday.

MESA STATE COLLEGE (2-0-0, 0-0-0 RMAC)

Offense: Daniela Ramirez (Senior, Forward, 5-3, Rupert, Idaho/Dodge City CC/Minico)

Ramirez scored the goal that proved to be the game winner at the start of the 30th minute against Augustana Friday afternoon in Durango, Colo. The goal lifted the Mavericks to a 1-0 win. Two days later against St. Cloud State, she tabbed an assist on the game-winning goal in another 1-0 win.

Defense: Sam Burneo (Freshman, Defense, 5-2, Las Vegas, Nev./Desert Oasis)

Burneo made some crucial stops in both games against Augustana and St. Cloud State to preserve victories and shutouts in both games. She made a stop against AC that would have tied the game.

METROPOLITAN STATE COLLEGE OF DENVER (2-0-0, 0-0-0 RMAC)

Offense: Taylor Nicholls (Junior, Forward, 5-3, Littleton, Colo./Heritage HS)

Nicholls had her first career multi-goal game, scoring both goals in a 2-0 win over Southwest Baptist (Mo.) on Monday. She found the net on a breakaway in the 23rd minute and again in the 47th minute. Nicholls had four shot attempts in the game.

Defense: Alee Seehausen (Junior, Goalkeeper, 5-9, Mesa, Ariz./Mountain View HS)

Seehausen earned her first two career wins, leading the Roadrunners to a pair of wins in non-conference action. In her first career start on Friday against Incarnate Word (Texas), she stopped seven shots in the 3-2 victory. When the lead was cut to one goal, she made two saves in the final 20 minutes to secure the win. In Monday's 2-0 shutout over Southwest Baptist (Mo.), Seehausen made two saves.

Offense: Jordan Miller (Junior, Forward, 5-9, Santa Fe, N.M./St. Michael's HS)

Miller tabbed three goals for six points last week against BYU-Hawaii (L, 0-4), Hawaii Pacific (W, 1-0, 2OT) and Minnesota-Duluth (W, 2-1 OT). She was held without a shot against BYUH before scoring the game-winning goal in overtime at Hawaii Pacific. Back home on Sept. 4, she scored another game-winner in overtime against UMD. She finished the week with 14 shots and 10 shots on goal.

Defense: Ellen Augsburg (Freshman, Goalkeeper, 5-3, Fenton, Mo./Nerinx Hall HS)

Augsburger recorded a 1-0 shutout in overtime at Hawaii Pacific on Aug. 28. Against Minnesota-Duluth in a 2-1 overtime win, she made one save in 96 minutes and 34 seconds between the posts. In over 200 minutes of action, she notched two wins, a shutout and one save.

UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO AT COLORADO SPRINGS (2-1-0, 0-0-0 RMAC)

Offense: Julia Saenz (Junior, Midfield, 5-6, Colorado Springs, Colo./St. Mary's HS)

Saenz had a goal and an assist in the Mountain Lions' 2-0 win at Southwest Minnesota State on Sept. 4. The next day, she added another assist in a 2-1 win over Northern State. In three games last week (Abilene Christian), Saenz tabulated one goal, two assists, four points and five shots.

Defense: Kelly Schroeder (Freshman, Goalkeeper, 5-7, Colorado Springs, Colo./Coronado HS)

Schroeder recorded her first career shutout in Saturday's 2-0 win over Southwest Minnesota State. The only goal allowed Sunday against Northern State was an own goal. Team Notes: The Lopers opened their season Sept. 26 at Wayne State (W, 1-0) and Sept. 28 at Mary (L, 0-2). UNK is 2-0 all-time against Wayne State and 0-19-1 against all other competition. Freshman Ralieg Mercer led the Lopers in shots in both games, having five at Wayne State and three at Mary. Sophomore Marissa Niday started the first half of each game in goal and then sophomore Vanessa Leeper—a first-year team member but a two-year basketball letterwinner -- started and played the entire second half. UNK has six newcomers crack the starting lineup in the season opener. They return to action today at home against Augustana, and Sept. 11 at home against Northern State.
